- □ Your site has been added to Google Search Console (GSC)
- $\hfill\square$ You've set the preferred www. or non-www. URL in GSC.
- $\hfill\square$ You've properly setup and submitted your sitemaps to GSC.
- □ You've checked the 'Crawl Errors' section of GSC.
- □ You've checked the 'HTML Improvements' section of GSC.
- □ You've 'fetched as Google' and ensured no robots.txt errors in GSC.
- $\hfill\square$ You've reviewed the rest of the areas of GSC for issues.
- You've done a site:http://yourwebsite.com search in Google to identify potential indexing issues.
- □ Your SEO plugin is professionally configured.
- □ Search engines are not discouraged from your site (Settings -> Reading).
- □ All images have defined 'alt' attribute.
- □ Your theme utilizes Schema Markup.
- □ The content on your website is unique and not copied or duplicate.
- □ You have clean permalinks.
- □ You are using a redirection plugin and monitoring for 404s (broken links)
- □ Your site speed is not an issue.
- □ Every Page's SEO Title is within width constraints.
- $\hfill\square$ All pages have a defined Meta Description that is proper length.
- □ You properly utilize H1 H6 tags to add hierarchy to content.
- □ Consider using Bing Webmaster Tools in addition to GSC.
- □ Your website is responsive and mobile friendly.
- □ You've audited your internal linking and interlink older posts.
- □ You have easily found social media sharing buttons.
